Money

= 1¢

Nickel



1 Nickel = 5 cents
= 5¢

Dime



1 Dime = 10 cents
= 10¢

Quarter



1 Quarter = 25 cents
= 25¢



Half Dollar



1 Half Dollar = 50 cents
= 50¢

Dollar



1 dollar = 100 cents
= 100¢ = \$1

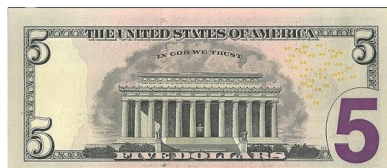
Paper Money
