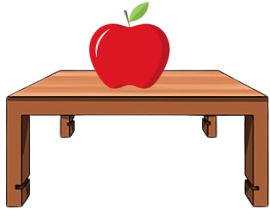


On and Under

On

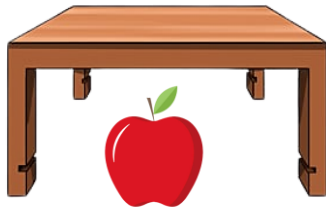
On is used to indicate that something is resting on top of or in contact with another object.



The apple is **on** the table.

Under

Under is used to indicate that something is below or beneath another object.

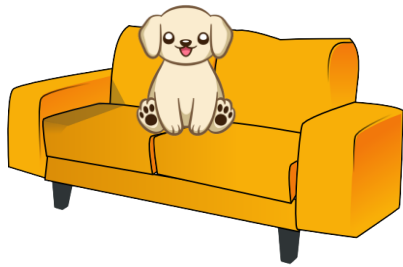


The apple is **under** the table.



The leaves **on** the tree were green in colour

The cycle is parked **under** the tree.



The dog is sitting **on** the coach.

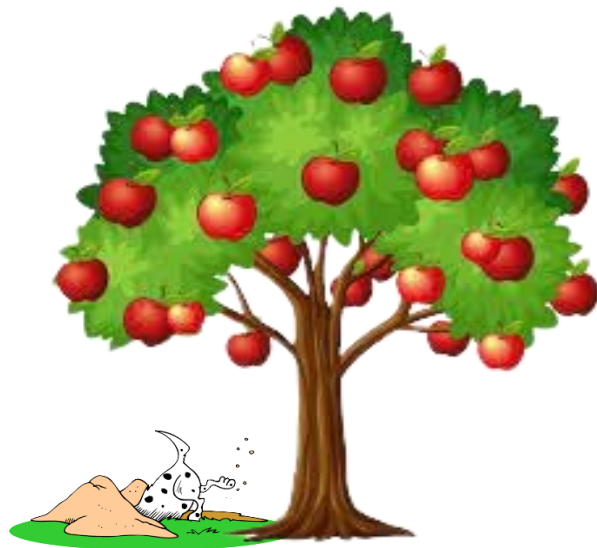
The newspaper lay **under** the coach
